RESEARCH SPOTLIGHT

The Future of Work

Many of you and your organizations may already be experiencing persistent and dramatic advancements in technologies that are transforming work and the workplace. New organizational models are being created, job tasks are shifting, and technology is changing the employment relationship.

Our School is leading an interdisciplinary research consortium on the future of work to address a variety of research questions. The consortium includes faculty from Psychology, Engineering, Economics, Communications, and Accounting and Information Systems. The College of Social Science selected the School's proposal on the future of work as a key thematic area and awarded the School a new faculty position. We recently hired Hye Jin Rho, a graduate of the Sloan School of Management at MIT. She will start in August 2020.
