Learn the following core skills and complete all four virtual sessions to earn your certification.

SESSION I - CRITICAL THINKING

Many of today's job descriptions list critical thinking as a desired skill. Learn how to analyze a situation objectively, consider available facts and diverse viewpoints, and make logical decisions.

SESSION II - IMPROVE DECISIONS BY MINIMIZING BIAS

As individuals, we all bring our own knowledge and prior experience to situations. This can lead to unknowingly allowing personal bias to affect our decision making. In Session II, learn how to identify when and how bias influences decisions, and how to minimize bias to improve decision making.

SESSION III - SOLVE THE RIGHT PROBLEM

Learning how to solve the right problem will save time and solidify your reputation as a critical thinker and problem solver! In this session, you will learn how to conduct a Root Cause Analysis to ensure you are solving the most urgent problem, the root cause. This practical tool will benefit you in any situation that requires problem solving.

SESSION IV - DECIDING HOW TO DECIDE

In this final session, learn how to determine when a decision is best made unilaterally, when it's best to consult with others, and when to allow the team to decide.
